MAYOR'S REPORT – Mayor Fiala said that on June 3rd, the Lake County Port Authority is organizing a meeting of all lakefront communities most of which are battling erosion along with the law firm of Brickler and Eckler (who are allegedly experts in the formation of Special Improvements Districts for lakefronts) to brief everyone on how to communicate the message to residents. He said on June 12th he is meeting with Euclid Mayor Holzheimer and staff members to review Euclid's lakefront and how it was funded.

Regarding communicating with the residents on lakefront matters on social channels, Mayor Fiala said he will be working with Shana Boyd on developing a plan to better communicate information on the lakefront and erosion control.

Mayor Fiala said he, Tom Thielman and Mike Lucas met with Steve Thompson today to discuss the future and Building A (the former Tech Center). He said the original developer defaulted based on his allegation that the land cost was too much. That subject was discussed with Mr. Thompson and he has left the door open on the subject. He said the City will work closely with Mr. Thompson to develop a plan to get the project moving forward. Mr. Carr asked if the original developer would be approached for the project. Mayor Fiala said the

original developer is struggling because they lost their equity because the host company has gone bankrupt and the land cost is too much. If the City can couple them with a new investment partner and get the land reduced, the City hopes that development team can carry on.

DIRECTOR'S REPORTS

Law Director Lucas - No report.

<u>Service Director Bock</u> — Reported that paving crews are out in the City. Grinding has been done on Strawberry and Sharpe and will be moving to Stevens and Biltmore. The work is not a one day process and will take about six weeks total to finish. Striping crews are still working throughout the City and will finish up in about four weeks.

Regarding the upcoming Service Committee meeting, Mr. Bock said Waste Management has requested some time to talk about automated collection which is something they are pushing and is now the standard in the industry. This would be a good time to learn about it as the City moves toward the bid process. He said there has been indication that some companies will only bid automated collection, but he's not sure it's every company. He suggested doing bid options for both. Mr. Woodin asked if there could be a discussion regarding pick up for senior residents and the current bag pick up at the upcoming discussion with Waste Management.

<u>City Engineer Sayles</u> – Reported the bid opening for the Plains Road Force Main is June 6th and is hoping for a bid award at the June 11th meeting.

<u>Fire Chief Ungar</u> – Thanked Council for allowing the swearing in and award ceremony this evening and the capital purchase.
