## WINTER REMINDERS

It's that time on year again winter, a few items to be aware of:

Please make sure you do not plow snow into the city streets or in your neighbor's tree lawn. Snow piles should not block the view to motorist.

Keep children from playing in the piles of snow by the roadways also the snow mounds in the cul-de-sacs; it is very dangerous for the children and the snowplow.

It is time to check the condition of your mailbox. The City of Willoughby is only responsible of damaged mailboxes that are hit by the blade of the snowplow and not by the snow. Regulations states that your mailbox should be 12" to 18" behind the curb.
