ELECTION DAY

Tuesday March 6th is Election Day. Reminder to vote and all of us vote at Willoughby South High School. This election day has a number of very important elections and issues on the ballot:

- 1. Presidential Primary
- 2. US Senator Primary
- 3. Lake County Commissioner Primary
- 4. County Treasurer, Judges and a number of other items

5. Probably the single most important, local issue is Willoughby -Eastlake School District Issue 4. Proposed additional Tax Levy. Having reviewed material in detail and discussing this with the School Superintendant, I along with all Mayors are in support of the levy and encourage a vote in favor of Issue 4. In addition to the increase in funding they are executing significant budget reductions and layoffs in order to address a serious shortfall. It is important to note that schools, like our City, is facing large reductions in local funding with State budget cuts. In addition, the recent news about closing the Eastlake Power Plant will mean an additional \$1M reduction in lost revenues. Please vote YES and support our schools.

CAPITAL SPENDING

Council is reviewing 2012 budget, including Capital requests. Safety (Fire and Police) remains our #1 priority and I am pleased to share some updates on recently approved Capital items. More details next month on 2012 Budget and other Capital requests.

Fire - New, state of the art EKG Cardiac monitor/defibrillators will be in all front line rescue vehicles (quantity 4). These will provide the highest level of cardiac care available in our community with direct radio feed to Lake West Hospital. Cost of \$100,000 is covered 100% by an anonymous donor in our community who's estate gifted directly to our Fire Rescue efforts.

New Rescue Squad to replace a 20 year old vehicle with high mileage.

Police - Soon you will notice a number of new Police vehicles. Ford discontinued the Crown Victoria style so the new vehicles will have a completely new body style. Total of 6 on order: 3 from 2011 Capital and 3 more with 2012 Capital. The change in body style will cost a little more to retrofit equipment but on a positive note the new Interceptor will be All Wheel Drive (AWD) which will be a very needed enhancement in our climate.

We are also ordering new, state of the art Mobile Computers and Video Systems in all police vehicles.


