The City of Willoughby continues to offer grass-clipping collections as part of our waste collection service. This service is designed for those who do not mulch or compost their grass.

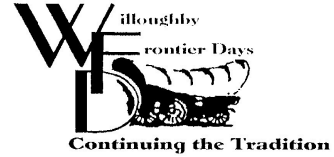
SEWER RATES

Starting with the first billing cycle after July, the sewer rates will be increasing \$0.50 per 100 cubic feet. This is the first increase since 2008 and our rates will continue to be much lower than the state average and one of the lowest in the immediate area. While usage is decreasing, the costs to operate the sewer plant continue to increase. Continued pressure from the EPA for additional improvements will continue this trend going forward. Our goal is to monitor closely and increase, only when necessary and in minor increments.

Some of you continue to inquire about "deduct meters" which would not charge for sewer when water is used for lawn watering. Council is looking into this as well as a potential summer watering program or flat rate billing for sewer usage. With the pending increase, no program changes will be implemented this year but likely a decision will be made for 2012.
