TRAFFIC CONTROL

As most of you already know, we were successful this past month in reducing the speed limit on SOM from 40 MPH to 35 MPH. Your continued plea for slowing down traffic or putting up a traffic light did help. With the support of Mayor Anderson, the City Law Director and the City Engineer we were able to determine and justify that the standard speed limit for the type of traffic on SOM should adhere to the 35 MPH standard under OH revised code. With this determination we were able to immediately reduce the speed without having to go thru traffic engineering studies. In addition, the City traffic department installed 8 speed limit signs along this corridor compared to the previous 3. Plus we put up Reduced Speed Ahead signage. I am sure you also noticed the portable sign stationed on the side of the road for a week which flashed your speed along with a sign showing the 35 MPH limit. Our Police Department was very visible this month running radar quite a bit. The comments have been extremely favorable and I believe the speed of traffic is noticeably slower over the last two weeks. I also met this past month with Mayor Anderson, our Traffic Engineering Dept and CT Consultants Traffic Engineer to schedule a formal traffic study along the SOM corridor to determine the proper number and placement of traffic lights. Special attention will be made in the area immediately in front of Big Turtle II where there have been a number of accidents and it is very difficult to maneuver the middle lane during the morning and afternoon rush hours as many parents are going in and out of the Montessori School while residents are also entering and leaving the Condominium complex. Once we have the results of this study, I will schedule a Ward meeting to review and share the findings. Also this month ODOT approved funding over \$800,000 to redo the intersection of Euclid and SOM. The lanes will be aligned better and new traffic signals. No more wires hanging and no more confusing lights not lined up with the lanes as you approach from the North. This project will take place next year - after July 2009.
