RT. 2 WIDENING PROJECT

Watch for more regular updates on the RT 2 and SOM road repairs. Karvo Paving was awarded a \$1.3M project to redo the Euclid - SOM Intersection, install new traffic signals and repave SOM, north to RT 2. This project should start July 5th and be completed by November 26th.

SUMMER SAFETY

As we get into the heat of summer, remember to keep doors and windows locked, including the door from your house to the garage. A resident recently shared with me a video showing how someone can unsecure an automatic garage door in a few seconds. I asked the Police Chief if this was an issue in Willoughby and he responded that the vast majority of break ins occur thru open doors and open cars. Amateurs look for the least resistive target, so lock up and they will likely look elsewhere.
