LAST STOP WILLOUGHBY

Last Stop Willoughby begins at 8 am on Sunday, August 20th with the Willoughby Outdoor Market featuring a variety of vendors from Northeast Ohio offering fruits, vegetables, breads, pastries and more. At 10 am, downtown Willoughby's retail merchants will kick off their sidewalk sale. The biggest addition is *"The Taste of Willoughby."* The participating downtown Willoughby restaurants will set up shop outside on the sidewalks outside their doors and serve food from Noon until 8 p.m. A ballot contest will determine who reigns supreme in a "People's Choice" competition. Using taste, customer service, and presentation, a secret panel will judge restaurants.

Entertainment in the gazebo will begin at noon and conclude at 9 pm. The Samantha Fitzpatrick Band, Plaid Sabbath, Terminal Blues Band, and Joe's Music will each bring a different sound to the event. The annual parade begins at 2 pm. For the kids, Trains at Your Place returns. There are also arts & crafts and games in the KidZone at Point Park. Trolley tours, which have been one of the most popular activities in past years, are returning with a little flair. Not only are the Historic Lolly the Trolley tours returning from noon – 7 pm, there is a special Haunted Trolley tour running from 7 pm to 9 pm. In addition, returning this year are train displays, located in City Hall and viewings of "A Stop at Willoughby," a Willoughby-inspired episode of The Twilight Zone.

Last Stop Willoughby will conclude with a 9 pm viewing of "Back to the Future" at Wes Point Park. Charter One Bank is sponsoring the popcorn.

Parking and driving restrictions for the event is as follows: River Street Closure all day – Prospect Street to Erie Street. Erie Street storefront parking spaces – closed all day for safety reasons. Following the Market – Parking will resume in the City Hall Parking lot.
