**MAYOR'S REPORT** — Mayor Fiala stated the City received a \$1.5 million grant from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) for the Vine Street Corridor that the City never applied for. The grant is an 80/20 match and there will be a meeting next week to determine how the money can be used. It will be a challenge in how the money is distributed between the municipalities.

Regarding the safety levy, Mayor Fiala stated the campaign committee is up and running and they are functioning on their own. There have been three ward meetings and two more in the next few weeks. Palm cards regarding the levy have been made and can be distributed by the City because they only contain the facts. The campaign committee is comprised of Jerry Ranally, Wade Mitchell, Seamus and McPat Coyne; Mayor Fiala will request a weekly report from the committee. Mr. Carr stated that the committee meets every Wednesday at 4:30 p.m. via Zoom or at TDA if anyone wants to attend. Contributions are being accepted by the campaign committee and yard signs will be available soon. Information on the levy can be found on the Citv website and there a levy campaign (www.willoughbycitizensforsafety) as well as a Facebook page.
