

FROM THE FIREHOUSE

OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS

With summer just around the corner, backyard bonfires and cookouts are a favorite way to enjoy the season. If you are going to have a fire in your backyard, please *keep in mind*:

- It needs to be in an approved container
- Must only burn dry-seasoned wood
- Must be at least 15ft away from a structure
- Must have a water source nearby

CONSTRUCTION & PROJECT UPDATES

NEW WILLOUGHBY POLICE STATION

Challenge: Outdated and overcrowded facility built in 1975.

Solution: Build a modern, expanded public safety facility to better serve community needs.

CHAGRIN RIVER FLOODPLAIN RESTORATION

Challenge: Habitat degradation and limited public access.

Solution: Restore the floodplain to protect natural areas, strengthen climate resiliency, and expand recreation opportunities.

OSBORNE PARK SHORELINE PROTECTION

Challenge: Severe erosion causing land loss and infrastructure risks.

Solution: Stabilize 1,400 feet of shoreline to prevent erosion, protect infrastructure, and improve lakefront access and safety.
