

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-23

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE BOARD OF LAKE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO AMEND THE ALLOCATION OF A PORTION OF THE ARPA FUNDS IN THE AGREEMENT FOR THE CHAGRIN RIVER RIPARIAN STORM WATER MANAGEMENT AND WATER QUALITY PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Lake County Commissioners (the "County") and the City of Willoughby (the "City") previously entered into a Subrecipient Agreement for the Chagrin River Riparian Storm Water Management and Water Quality Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County has determined to amend a line-item allocation for a portion of the Project's ARPA funds, with the total originally allocated amount under the Agreement remaining unchanged; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Board of Lake County Commissioners to set forth the terms of the line-item allocation amendment and reallocation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY, THE COUNTY OF LAKE, AND THE STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Board of Lake County Commissioners, 105 Main Street, P.O. Box 490, Painesville, Ohio 44077 for the reallocation of a portion of the ARPA funds in the Agreement for the Chagrin River Riparian Storm Water Management and Water Quality Project; said Memorandum of Understanding substantially in the form now on file in the Finance Department.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were conducted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such actions were conducted in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Willoughby.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of the community; and for the further reason to receive reimbursement costs for the Project ; and provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall be in full force and take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
